Virtual Assembly:

However, there are still many unanswered questions which we hope will be answered by the SQA and our Local Authority in the near future. We acknowledge the stress and anxiety that the on-going uncertainty is generating for our senior pupils and also our staff and we would like to assure you that as a school, we will do our very best for our learners and also to support our staff for the vast workload that these changes inevitably imply.

Pupil Learning Toolkits

Our Leader of Learning, Mrs H Campbell has been busy with the help of Technician Miss S Kyle, putting S1 – S6 learning packs together for all pupils. These were distributed at registration this week.

The toolkits include a range of items including small white boards, a whiteboard pen, sponges and emoji cards.

SQA - A message for Parents and Carers (8 December 2020)

On 7 October, the Deputy First Minister announced that for 2020-21, National 5 results will be based on teacher and lecturer judgement supported by a robust set of checks – or quality assurance – which will be carried out by your child's school or college, local authority and SQA. The National Qualifications 2021 Group has overseen the development of the quality assurance process which will support teachers and lecturers in providing your child's provisional results for session 2020-21. Provisional results will be based on teachers' and/or lecturers' professional judgement of your child's evidence. The results will be finalised following various layers of quality assurance, including sampling by SQA senior subject specialists

Here is how the National 5 quality assurance model will work in session 2020-21:

November 2020 to March 2021 - Teachers and lecturers use guidance and assessment materials to help gather learner evidence.

January to April - SQA requests, reviews, and provides feedback on samples of assessment evidence from each school and college.

March to May - Schools, colleges and local authorities will work through SQA feedback and carry out their own quality assurance of the provisional results.

By 28 May - Schools and colleges submit quality assured provisional results.

June

SQA carries out national check of provisional results and may follow up on any issues with schools, colleges and local authorities. These processes are in place to ensure that a National 5 awarded in the North of Scotland is of the same standard as one which is awarded in the South of Scotland, and everywhere in between.

Most of the support will be provided before the school or college submit your child's provisional results to SQA. This should reduce the need for schools and colleges to resubmit provisional results following SQA review in June. If your child's provisional results need to be adjusted to reflect their evidence, this will follow discussion between their school or college and SQA.

Fairness for your child

SQA is developing an equality impact assessment as part of this quality assurance model which aims to ensure fair and credible results for all National 5 learners. Schools, colleges, local authorities and SQA are committed to working together to support teachers and lecturers in providing their provisional results in 2020-21.

We are discussing the appeals process for 2020-21 and will keep you informed of progress. To stay up to date on 2021 National Qualifications visit www.sqa.org.uk/NQ2021.

Heating and Ventilation Up-date:

Staff and pupils can all wear 'permissible flexible clothing' in school in order to remain warm where this is necessary; this includes outdoor coats and jackets.

Our latest risk assessment update has the following information/guidance from the LA regarding heating and ventilation:

Schools should as a minimum ensure that adequate levels of ventilation and appropriate temperatures are maintained, with reference to the School Premises Regulations. The primary effective method of increasing natural ventilation remains the opening of external doors, vents and windows. Wherever it is practical, safe and secure to do so, and appropriate internal temperatures can be maintained in line with statutory obligations, this approach should be adopted.

Ventilation

- *partially opening doors and windows to provide ventilation whilst reducing draughts*
- *opening high level windows in preference to low level to reduce draughts*
- *purging spaces by opening windows, vents and external doors (e.g. between classes, during break and lunch, when a room is unused, or at other suitable intervals if a space is occupied for long periods at a time)*

Temperature

- *providing flexibility in permissible clothing while indoors – including coats and jackets.*
- *designing seating plans to reflect individual student/staff temperature preferences*
- *adjusting indoor heating to compensate for cold air flow from outside (e.g. higher system settings, increased duration)*

Centralised or local mechanical ventilation systems should wherever possible be adjusted to full fresh air. Air recirculation should be avoided or minimised.

Our Young Enterprise pupils have been so busy making lovely Christmas candles, wax melts and photo frames and will be stationed in the sunken social area to display and sell their products at various break and lunchtimes in the run up to Christmas.
