Covid Up-dates:

Following the FMs announcement on Tuesday 22 February, the following changes are now in place for secondary schools effective Monday 28 February. The Ellon Academy Covid-19 Risk Assessment will be updated and posted on our school website in due course. Here are the changes:

Face Coverings:

- Pupils and staff in secondary schools are no longer required to wear face coverings in classrooms.
- Adults, however, should continue to wear them if they cannot keep physical distance with other adults/pupils.
- Any young person or staff member who wishes to still wear a face covering in the classroom should be fully supported in doing so.
- Face coverings should continue to be worn by secondary school pupils and all adults in indoor communal areas.

Assemblies:

- The remaining restrictions on assemblies are now removed.
- Schools should continue to employ the relevant mitigations e.g. physical distancing, ventilation, and the use of face coverings where appropriate i.e. when less than 1m apart

P7 Transitions:

- Transition visits can now resume if appropriately risk assessed.

Distancing:

- Staff/visitors should still maintain a physical distance of at least 1 metre from others.
- As schools should already have 2m physical distancing arrangements that work well and do not limit capacity, we will retain these 2m distancing arrangements

SQA Up-date:

As per Scottish Government plans, the SQA exam diet will go ahead this year for our Senior Phase learners taking N5, Higher and Advanced Higher exams.

Ms Booth is already planning to deliver in-person assemblies for S4/5/6 learners to ensure they are fully aware of the range of SQA expectations and regulations involved in taking part in an official exam diet.

We are awaiting information from the SQA due on Monday 7th March which will provide details of the revision our learners will be directed to, and our staff welcome this to ensure targeted support in class in the run up to the exams.

Study Leave will also go ahead and will start on Monday 25th April for all S4/5/6 learners and will run until the last exam on Wednesday 1st June. We expect our timetable to change after the Queen's Platinum Jubilee weekend on Monday 6th June.

S4 Virtual Parents Evening – Wed 2.3.22 (4.00pm – 6.30pm)

Based on the experience of the S1 Virtual Pastoral Parents' Evening in December and the S2 and S3 Virtual Parents Evening on 26.1.22 and 17.2.22, we are again offering virtual appointments to S4 parents to attend the first parents' evening in quite some time for our current S4 cohort of learners.

Due to the digital nature of the Parents Evening Booking system (PEBs) staff have the option of conducting the parents evening in school of from home, depending on their personal circumstances.

Also, there can be no additional appointments added prior to or after the designated time slot of 4.00pm – 6.30pm. Secondary teachers have a minimum of 5 parents' evenings across any given school year, excluding P7 Parents Evening and other Family Learning events. Also, based on national and local guidelines set by the Scottish Government, Local Authorities and teaching unions, teaching staff must work within their set *Working Time Agreement* (WTA). The WTA agreement is set in May of each calendar year and locally agreed in schools with staff and professional union representatives and then ratified by the local authority. Over and above the teaching day, the WTA takes into account additional teacher time for marking, preparation, reporting, parents' evenings, staff meetings and professional learning, so no additional appointments can be made available.

Also, unfortunately, it is not possible for teachers to give individual feedback to parents/carers who have been unable to secure an appointment with their child's teacher(s) for the S4 Parents' Evening on Wednesday 2 March. This would lead to an unacceptable workload for teachers and would be out with the agreed annual allocation of time for reporting within the Working Time Agreement.

Full reports were issued in December detailing your child's strengths, areas for development and next steps to reach their February Target Grade. In class, teachers will have given detailed feedback on prelim performance and offered suggestions on how further progress can be made post-prelim going forward. Many pupils will have had one-to-one feedback during learner conversations with teachers, jointly agreeing targets and next steps.

S4 tracking reports are due to be issued the week beginning 7 March. This report will indicate your child's current Working Grade along with ratings for Behaviour, Effort and Homework. Their February Target

Grade and their Next Target Grade will also be included. This will give parents/carers the most up-to-date information on their current performance.

As usual, Principal Teachers of Guidance should be your first point of contact if you have any concerns regarding your child.

Feedback from the Parent Council regarding the virtual on-line appointments was extremely positive at our meeting on Wed 23.2.22.

S3/4/5 Course Choice Information:

Dear all,

We are pleased to make you aware of short courses which are on offer at NESCOL to assist you in preparing for end of year exams in Higher Sciences and Maths. We would be grateful if you are able to pass this information onto your learners.

Over seven evening sessions in the weeks leading up to the final exam, learners will work in small groups with other candidates to practice exam-style questions.
