Exam Success: The vast majority of our senior pupils are to be congratulated on their personal best exam successes. Exam results are unique to each individual learner and it is clear that high percentages of our pupils have achieved or exceeded their personal best in gaining the best set of results for them. Our Ellon Academy Vision embodies our hopes for each learner:

At whole school level, our S4 (new S5) pupils have performed exceptionally well and 69% of pupils have achieved 5 or more awards at National 5 level. This is the highest percentage of S4 NAT 5 awards at Ellon Academy for 6 years and it is testament to the hard work and dedication of pupils and staff. This is also well above the Aberdeenshire Secondary Schools average. In S5 (new S6) we have exceeded our passes at Higher by 12% and 25 of our pupils across the senior school have achieved straight A passes at all subjects and levels.

Congratulations to everyone and to you, our parents and carers who have supported our learners at home too.

Some of our senior pupils asked us to consider offering breakfast for pupils who at times, may come to school hungry.

Aberdeenshire Council is now adding £1 on a daily basis to the National Entitlement Cards of those pupils who are entitled to Free School Meals. Ellon Academy support this initiative and light breakfasts are available for all pupils at a low cost. Our Humanities staff are also planning to offer toast for any young person who'd like to join them for breakfast on school day mornings.



Comfort Cabinet

We have set up a "Comfort Closet" for any of our young people in genuine need to access privately.

The Cabinet enables young people to access toiletries, school dress items, school bags, pens, pencils etc in total privacy. These cabinets are sited in a space out of view of others to enable young people to be left to choose what they need in private. Popular items are:

Toiletries, shampoo, shower gel, toothpaste, toothbrushes, deodorant etc.

Clothing new or used, School uniform, jackets, Shoes/trainers etc.

Stationery, pencils, pens, highlighters, folders, dividers etc.

School bags, school ties, books for them to read, old DVD's, colouring books etc.

At the moment our cabinet is full to capacity thanks to the generosity of parents and members of the community and we want to thank everyone who has so generously donated items. We will let you know when we are running low on specific items in the future.



School Dress

Thank you to all parents and carers who have supported us on school dress standards this summer. We really appreciate your support and acknowledge and it may have been a challenge for some!

We will continue to maintain high standards of school dress and we are currently looking at the best and most economical deals with School Blazer companies, so more information will follow if your child would like the option of wearing a school blazer. 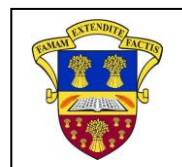
